Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

Section 1. Prior to entering into a contract to teach in any public school, each applicant, i.e., the person desiring to enter into such contract with the governing body of any school district, shall file with such body a signed written statement containing the following information:

(1) Whether the applicant is or has been a member of or is or has been affiliated with the Communist Party or any other organization that believes in, advocates or teaches the overthrow of the United States Government or of the government of the State of Oregon by force or any unlawful means.

(2) Whether the applicant has contributed time or money to the support of, or has subscribed to, taught or advocated the principles of such party or organization.

(3) If the statement indicates that the applicant is or has engaged in any of the activities specified in subsections (1) or (2), or both, of this section, the

statement shall also contain a detailed explanation of the applicant's participation or conduct in relation to such activities.

Section 2. Any statement filed under the provision of section 1 of this Act shall be attached to and become a part of any teacher's contract entered into by the applicant and the governing body with which the statement was filed.

Section 3. Failure to state fully, completely and accurately any information required by section 1 of this Act is misrepresentation sufficient to permit the school district governing body to terminate the teacher's contract without further liability thereon by the school district or the members of such body.
