

HISTORY

GENERAL In the preparation of this, the first report to be made by the Director of Veterans' Affairs of Oregon, it is fitting to record a brief history of the legislation which has established the office of the Director of Veterans' Affairs and made provisions for the benefits which he has been directed to administer.

In recognition of service rendered, the State of Oregon granted certain benefits to war veterans following the first World War. The most prominent of these benefits consisted of loans, educational aid, and a cash bonus, but nothing was done to adequately provide for assistance to veterans or their dependents in obtaining any benefits other than those provided by the state. For such additional service, veterans were dependent upon the Red Cross and patriotic organizations, with personnel not always qualified to supply the service required. There was a realization, especially among veterans of World War I that there must be supplied a better type of service to the augmented group of veterans caused by those returning from service in World War II.

This realization resulted in an organization established by the state legislature in 1943, known as the War Veterans Service Committee. This committee consisted of three men appointed by the Governor and an executive secretary, and such help as available funds might permit and as service needs might require. The executive secretary was set up in an office in Portland and began rendering service to veterans immediately after the office was opened.

This operation was so successful in its limited territory that it was felt that the scope should be expanded and this was done by the 1945 legislature when it established the office of Director of Veterans' Affairs. The Director absorbed all the activities of the War Veterans Service Committee and, in addition to this, he was charged with the organization and coordination of the administration of all laws, federal and state, pertaining to the 147,000 war veterans and their dependents in this state.

To make funds available for these loans, bonds were issued in accordance with the provisions of the act establishing the department, and the first issue of bonds amounting to \$1,000,000 was sold September 21, 1945.

There is attached a copy of the accumulated report made by the Director as of September 30, 1946, which shows the number of loan applications received and loans made as of that date.

EDUCATIONAL AID An educational benefit was given to veterans of World War I by the State of Oregon to assist them in obtaining or completing an education. The Oregon state legislature, in 1943, passed an act which would extend this same benefit to qualified Oregon veterans of World War II following the end of the war. This act was amended at the 1945 session of the legislature and its administration definitely placed in the hands of the Director of Veterans' Affairs.

The amended act became effective on July 1, 1945, and the Director immediately set about preparing the necessary forms and disseminating information relative to the benefit to the various schools and colleges throughout the state. Preliminary work was done and the department actually started to function in regard to receiving applications for educational benefits early in September, 1945, prior to the opening of fall terms of schools and colleges.

There is attached a quarterly report made as of September 30, 1946, which shows the number of educational applications received and acted upon as of that date.
