

State Voters' Pamphlet Deadlines

Applicable to candidates for state offices and candidates for local offices eligible to appear in the state voters' pamphlet. These deadlines do not apply to county voters' pamphlets. Contact your county elections official.

First Day to File Prospective Petition	September 14, 2023
First Day to File by Fee or Completed Petition	January 22, 2024
Last Day to File by Fee or Completed Petition	March 14, 2024, 5:00:00 pm
Last Day to Withdraw	March 14, 2024, 5:00:00 pm
Last Day to Submit Signatures for Guaranteed Verification	February 29, 2024, 5:00:00 pm
Statements Become Public	March 20, 2024

! If 100% of the required signatures are submitted by this date, the elections official will verify signatures so they can be used as payment. Signatures filed after this date may not be verified by the filing deadline and the filer would be required to pay the fee instead.

! Voters' pamphlet records are exempt from public disclosure until the 4th business day after filing deadline.

Filing by Fee or Petition

For a candidate statement or measure argument filing to be considered complete it must be accompanied by the required filing fee or a voters' pamphlet petition containing the required number of verified signatures.

By Fee

Payments must be processed before the filing deadline at 5:00:00 pm.

Statements and Arguments may still be amended up until the deadline.

By Petition

The required number of signatures must be verified by the appropriate election officials by the deadline at 5:00:00 pm.

The petition must first be approved to circulate before signatures can be gathered. The statement or argument cannot be amended after this point.

Signers must be active registered voters in the associated district, but don't need to be registered in the same party as the candidate (if applicable).

Signatures are verified by elections officials on a first come, first served basis.

Endorsements

Candidate statements and measure arguments that include the name of a person or organization as supporting or endorsing the candidate or a measure require that person's or the organization's permission. Their permission must be documented on an [SEL 400 Statement of Endorsement](#) form. Filers must submit a completed and signed [SEL 400](#) for each person or organization identified in the statement or argument or include a publicly disseminated quote identified by source and date.

Filing Requirements for Local Candidates

If the relevant county is producing a voters' pamphlet, local candidates must file their statement directly with the county. Contact the county elections official for information as to whether the county is publishing a voters' pamphlet and if so, how to be included.

Local candidates, including metropolitan service district candidates, county candidates or city candidates in cities with populations over 50,000 (Albany, Beaverton, Bend, Corvallis, Eugene, Gresham, Hillsboro, Medford, Portland, Salem, Springfield and Tigard) may file statements for inclusion in the state voters' pamphlet **only** if the county does not print its own voters' pamphlet.

The following information pertains only to local candidates eligible to file in the state voters' pamphlet.

District Office

ⓘ Metropolitan service district candidates may appear in the state voters' pamphlet only if the county in which the district is located, is not producing a voters' pamphlet. No other district candidates may appear in the State Voters' Pamphlet. If the county in which the special district is located in does not produce a voters’ pamphlet, the candidate will not appear in any official voters’ pamphlet.

Filing Requirements for State and Local Measures

State Measure

At this time no state measures will appear on the 2024 primary election ballot.

Local Measure

A county measure, a community college district measure relating to bonding, or metropolitan service district measure may only appear in the State Voters’ Pamphlet in the following circumstances:

- The county is not producing a voters’ pamphlet;
- A ballot title and explanatory statement are drafted and a process is in place for review of the ballot title and explanatory statement;
- Submission of arguments is allowed by county charter or ordinance and the cost of submission is no more than \$300 or 1,000 signatures;

and

- A request is filed with the county elections official that the measure be included in the voters’ pamphlet.

⚠ **City measures are not eligible to appear in the state voters' pamphlet.**

How to File in ORESTAR

All candidate statements must be submitted electronically using ORESTAR. Filers are required to have a user account in ORESTAR to submit a statement for inclusion in the State Voters' Pamphlet. General steps to get filers started are outlined on the next page. Detailed steps can be found in the [ORESTAR User's Manual: Voters' Pamphlet Filing](#) available at www.oregonvotes.gov.

- ❗ ORESTAR may become slow to respond due to increased activity approaching the filing deadline. Filers are **strongly encouraged** to complete their filings, including payment, early. Completed fee filings may still be amended up until the deadline.
- ❗ Filings must be completed by the deadline at 5:00:00pm. A filing is not considered complete until it is submitted and paid for by fee or verified signature.

Basic ORESTAR Steps

- 1 Create an ORESTAR user account.
- 2 Access your Private Workshop by logging into ORESTAR.
- 3 Click Submit New Filing from the vertical menu bar in the left frame of ORESTAR and select File Voters' Pamphlet Statement/Argument.
- 4 Complete all required fields in the Filing Information and Statement Tabs.
- ❗ Petition filers **cannot change** their statement or argument unless they begin the petition process again or pay the required filing fee.
- 5 Upload photos and statement of endorsements in the Uploads tab.
- ❗ Photos and any statements of endorsements are due no later than 5:00:00 pm on the filing deadline. They are not required to be submitted with the initial filing.
- 6 Once complete click Submit Filing to attest to the accuracy of the statement/argument and to pay fee or request approval to circulate.
